Handy Information for School Group Organisers

Before the event

- The event **Risk Assessment** will be emailed to you prior to the event.
- Wristbands are the entry **tickets** for both staff and students and will be sent 1-2 weeks before the show. Payment must be received before your wristbands are sent. If paying by BACS or cheque please make sure this is received by 3rd July, in order for you to receive your tickets in time.

Planning Your Day

- To ensure you have an enjoyable time at the show please take time to **plan your day**. Please read the information below, study the map along with the event timetables.
- You can also check out the **What's On** section of the website greatyorkshireshow.co.uk/whats-on/ for more attractions.

Safety

- The **Visitors' Code of Conduct** will be emailed to you prior to the event.
- Do not attend the Show if you are showing any coronavirus symptoms.
- Hand washing facilities and sanitising stations will be available at the Showground.
- Visitors will not be admitted inside the cattle sheds at any time.

Travel & Parking

- The show is open from **8am until 6pm** on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.
- Please allow extra travel time to arrive at the showground so you can enjoy a full day.
- Please follow the event signage once you are in the vicinity of Harrogate. If arriving by coach or minibus you will be directed to the **coach park** by stewards.
- If travelling by car you will be directed to public parking.
- The coach park is opposite **Brown Gate** where you will show your wristbands and enter the showground.
- Please ensure the wristbands have been distributed to your group and are securely fastened to pupils' and accompanying adults' wrists before arriving at the showground. We strongly recommend you write a phone number on the wristbands of primary aged pupils in case a child becomes separated from your group.
- We offer free entry for coach drivers on production of their CSV licence, please let your driver know.

Lunch

- The best place to picnic is on the **hill below the Discovery Zone**. With plenty of open space and toilets nearby, from here you can relax and enjoy views over the showground. Alternatively, if you are on the other side of the showground when hunger strikes, the **President's Lawn** has plenty of space to take a seat or the new **Picnic Area** near white gate.
- Please use the bins provided around the showground. We work with a local company called HACS who manage our waste which they sort off site and recycle as much as possible. This means there is no need to sort your waste and it can all be placed in one bin.

Toilets

- There are numerous toilet blocks around the showground. Please check the map for locations. Most blocks contain disabled toilets which are identified on the map.
- There is a Changing Places facility including hoist and height adjustable changing table within the Food Hall building, please request access from the reception in the hall foyer.

Discovery Zone (C4)

The best place to view shows in the **Main Ring** is the public, open viewing area, which is at the right-hand end of the ring (when looking at the map), close to the band stand. STAY SAFE AROUND ANIMALS

What to DO when visiting an animal area

- WASH YOUR HANDS THOROUGHLY WITH SOAP AND WATER AFTER YOU HAVE TOUCHED ANY ANIMALS OR OTHER SURFECES IN THE ANIMAL AREAS AND ESPECIALLY BEFORE EATING OR DRINKING.
- Do not put hands on faces or fingers in mouths after touching an animal.
- Do not allow children to put their faces close to animals.
- Do not eat or drink while touching animals or walking around an animal area. This includes not eating sweets, crisps or ice cream.
- Do not eat anything that has fallen on the floor.
- Do supervise children closely to ensure that they wash their hands thoroughly.
- Do take care if you are pregnant and avoid contact with lambs and their droppings.
- Do not use hand gels or wipes as they are not a substitute for washing hands with running ~~wam~~water & soap.

Health & Hygiene

Visiting The Great Yorkshire Show is an enjoyable and educational experience. However, such visits can never be free from all risks. Farm animals naturally carry a range of microorganisms, some of which may be harmful to people even when the animals appear clean and healthy.

Microorganisms such as *E. coli* O157 and Cryptosporidium are a particular health risk, especially for young children, expectant mothers, and the elderly.

Touching animals, consuming contaminated food or drink and contact with dirty surfaces may lead to infection **if microorganisms are accidentally transferred into the stomach.**

Washing hands thoroughly with soap and water immediately after contact with animals will reduce the risk of infection. Hand gels or wipes are not a substitute for washing hands with running water in an agricultural environment.

There are several permanent toilet blocks with washing facilities on the Showground and their locations are clearly indicated on the Showground map.

Always wash your hands regularly with soap and warm water and always after contact with any animal. Stay safe and keep others safe.

Animals have feelings too – Please respect them and keep a safe distance as a startled animal may well kick-out or bite!
